The grooming area will open at 5:30 AM. Placement of entries will be from 6:30 AM – 9:30 AM. Exhibitors must place all their challenge class entries. There will be a placement table receiving all other entries. Judging of the show will begin at 10:00 AM.

Trophies must be picked up during show tear down.

**Rules**

1. **TIME & PLACE:** Entries will be accepted from 6:30 a.m. until 9:30 a.m. on show date. Judging will begin at 10:00 a.m.
2. **ELIGIBLE EXHIBITORS:** This show is open to all amateur rose growers and arrangers who need not be a member of any rose organization, except where noted in special classes.
3. **ENTRIES:** All entries are under control of the show committee and shall not be moved or removed until the show closes. However, the show committee reserves the right to remove any roses. All blooms must have been grown in the exhibitor's own outdoor garden. No more than one exhibitor or team may place blooms from the same garden. More than one specimen of the same variety from the same garden in the same class automatically disqualifies all those entries.
4. **TAGS:** Entries shall be labeled on standard ARS tags as to the name of the rose and classification entered; tags completed on both top and bottom portions and attached to base by rubber bands. In classes requiring more than one specimen in individual vases, a tag should be attached to each vase. Vases for single specimens will be available at the show.
5. **WEDGES:** The use of wedges to better position a specimen rose or a group of roses in a vase is permitted. Wedges of clear plastic, aluminum foil, oasis or Styrofoam are permitted.
6. **EXHIBITION NAME:** All roses must be exhibited under their ARS Exhibition names, as listed in bold type in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses or in updates published by the American Rose Society. A rose variety need not be registered with ARS to be exhibited in this show, but must be listed in one of these ARS publications: Modern Roses or supplements; The American Rose, the American Rose Annual, The Handbook or supplements thereof, or the Combined Rose list. The most recent ARS publication is the final authority. The responsibility for proper identification and classification rest with the exhibitor. Reasonable abbreviations are acceptable, but not desirable.
7. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY:** Due care will be given to safe guard exhibits, but neither the South Central District or the American Rose Society will be responsible for loss or damage to entries, property, or person.
8. **NOVICE EXHIBITORS:** A novice is an otherwise eligible exhibitor who has never won a blue ribbon in a standard rose show. Participation in this division does not prevent exhibiting in other divisions.
9. **JUDGING:** Judging will start promptly at 10:30 a.m. and will be done by ARS Judges in accordance with guidelines for Judging Roses published by the American Rose Society. Specimens exhibited will be judged on the following scale

Judges will disqualify any entry which does not comply with American Rose Society rules. **Disqualification will result from:**

- (1) misnamed, misclassified, unlabeled, mislabeled or misplaced;
- (2) stem-on-stem, except for Old Garden Roses & shrubs;
- (3) presence of a foreign substance on foliage, stem, or bloom;
- (4) the appearance of the exhibitor's name in any location other than the designated places on the entry tag;
- (5) any violation of show rules.

This is an alphabetical show. All classes will be shown alphabetically except the challenge classes.

10. **DURING JUDGING:** Only clerks, judges and other authorized show committee personnel will be permitted in the show area.
11. **PLACEMENT:** Exhibitors may place their own entries at the discretion of the exhibitor. He/she will have no restriction on the relative placement of the individual specimens, except that some classes may have space limitation. Exhibitors must not move or interfere with other entries when placing their entries. The placement committee will place all other entries if requested. Exhibitors are permitted only one entry per Challenge Class in all Sections.
12. **JUDGE'S ENTRY:** All judges who are judging in this show may enter the special Judges' Challenge Class Section F, Classes 32 & 33.

### CLASS 4 MODERN ROSE BOUQUET

### CLASS 5 OLD GARDEN ROSE BOUQUET

SIX (6) OR MORE OLD GARDEN ROSES, no fewer than three (3) varieties, with or without side buds with blooms predominating, hips are permitted, floral foam is permitted. Container to be provided by the exhibitor.

### CLASS 6 SHRUB ROSE TRIO

THREE (3) SHRUB ROSES, each a different variety, one bloom per stem and/or sprays displayed in separate containers.

### **CLASS 7 STANDARD STAGES OF BLOOM**

THREE (3) HYBRID TEAS OR GRANDIFLORAS, each of the same variety, one bloom per stem, in different stages of bloom, displayed in separate containers. Stages to be one bloom 1/4 to 1/3 open, one bloom at exhibition stage and one bloom fully open (stamens must show).

TWO (2) HYBRID TEAS OR GRANDIFLORAS, each of the same variety, one bloom per stem, no side buds, at exhibition stage, in separate containers.

### **CLASS 9 ACHING BACK CHALLENGE**

THREE (3) HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS OR FLORIBUNDAS, each a different variety, one bloom per stem, no side buds, at exhibition stage, displayed in separate containers. **This class restricted to those exhibitors 60 or older at time of rose show.**

Including roses of unknown dates known to have been in existence prior to 1867. One stem of one or more blooms.
